2020 VCE and VCAL Results

The month of December is a significant one for all Year 12 students across the state but last year was like no other. The official end of secondary school for these students was later than previous years, as was the date they received details of their academic performance in the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and the Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL).

All members of the St Patrick's College community share an interest in the academic performance of the Year 12 class in what has been a truly unique final year. It is a time to celebrate the academic excellence and endeavour of individual students and of the year level as a whole. We are particularly proud of the resilience and fortitude of our Year 12 class of 2020. Following is a summary of their academic achievements:

General information:

- 182 boys completed Year 12 studies at St Patrick's College in 2020. Of these, 175 completed studies in the VCE program (scored and non-scored) and a further seven in the Applied Learning (VCAL) program.
- 99% percent of the boys studying in the VCE program attained their Victorian Certificate of Education.
- 292 Senior School students were enrolled in at least one VCE Units 3/4 subject. These boys completed studies in 42 different VCE Unit 3/4 subjects in 2020.
- There were 42 study scores of 40 or above before scaling (or 4.7% of all study scores), and an additional 12 study scores of 40 or above after scaling. These scores were attained in 20 different VCE and VET studies.
- Thirteen students attained an ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank) of 90 and above. A further 20 students attained an ATAR of 80 and above.
- The **2020 College Dux**, with an ATAR of **98**, was **Kai O'Keeffe**. Congratulations to Kai on this outstanding result!
- The median study score for all VCE and VET studies was 28 and the median ATAR was 62.45.
- 121 Year 12 students applied for a tertiary place (66% of all Year 12 boys).
- 207 students were enrolled in at least one of the 28 VCE VET certificates studied in 2020, with 93% attaining unit competency completion.

Traditionally, an **ATAR of 90** or above has been used as a measure of academic excellence. In 2020, thirteen students attained this outstanding result:

A study score of 50 represents the highest mark achievable within the VCE for any particular subject. In 2020, this extraordinary result was achieved by two students - Joseph Freeman for Literature and Year 11 student Connor Gaffney for Further Mathematics. These outstanding results aptly reflect the exceptional quality of these boys' work and their excellent commitment to classwork throughout 2020. Congratulations to Joseph and his Literature teacher, Mr Joseph Magee and also to Connor and his Further Mathematics teacher, Mr Steven Biggin.

Another of the measures commonly reported on to assess academic success in VCE studies is the number of study scores of 40 and above. Following is a list of all boys who attained this result both before scaling (^) and after scaling (*) in 2020:

St Patrick's College offers a variety of learning pathways to ensure that each boy has every opportunity to achieve personal success. Our 2020 Applied Learning students continued their success with four boys awarded the Senior Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning. During the school year 39 Senior School students successfully attained an apprenticeship, 19 students have been successful in gaining direct employment and six students commenced vocational training courses.

I would like to conclude by acknowledging the significant work of all St Patrick's College teachers and support staff. We also recognise the significant support offered by the St Patrick's College families. The College's level of academic success in 2020 did not happen by chance. We celebrate these remarkable results understanding the significant difficulties and disruption to learning that our students experienced this year. It reflects a commitment to ensuring a teaching and learning culture that values and supports academic excellence and endeavour whether in the classroom or through remote learning. This has happened because St Patrick's teachers remain committed to continually reviewing and developing curriculum that provides every opportunity for our boys to experience academic success.
